Notably all of these programmes except "This is Metal" (formerly Matt and Ali's Metal Radio) are from first year TrentU students. - Two unrelated shows concerning the topic of sex; "Naked" and "Sex with Sleezy Heezy". They differ in that one deals primarily with health and awareness, and the other anecdotal stories.

Goals for Fall 2009:

Extend hours of programming. With an already packed afternoon and evening schedule, I am specifically targeting the early morning by re-establishing weekday morning Operator shifts, and recruiting morning Operators and the co-op student for operational support for this period. To some degree, afternoon shifts can be covered by staff.

While programmers may be reluctant to schedule earlier than 10am, I am eager that prospective programmers will be steered towards an earlier start regardless, especially now that there is Operator support set up for that time.

Increase communication with students on campus. Articles published through the "Arthur" newspaper (see attached) have already proven their worth for reaching both first year and returning students. The Arthur articles are a quick and relatively easy way to increase campus awareness, and to foster a better relationship with other student groups. More focus is being put on getting the schedule ready and available sooner in the broadcast season so that it can have increased exposure and circulation through the "Arthur", reviving an old tradition going back thirty years when we published our schedules as features. Other ideas for increased communication on campus include the reintroduction of an on-campus Programme Proposal Workshop just after Christmas, with the intention of expanding likeworkshops in coming years to increase our presence on campus and in the community as well, both in the fall and spring time.

Studio A Fall 2009: John Muir continues as the Studio A trainer. Fluctuating schedules have dictated that I stand in for John on occasion, which should not interfere with the higher standard of On Air training that has been alleviating Operator headaches since John took on this responsibility, provided I keep up my studio training with John at least once per year.

Studio B Fall 2009: Geoffrey Forrest is the Studio B trainer this year. His friendly attitude and kindness makes him very approachable to post-production neophytes. As a result, we do not have to worry about the "intimidation factor" of Studio B, one of the major challenges in that area. Geoffrey looks forward to helping programmers realise their potential "in the can".

PD Assistant Fall 2009: After serving the last few months as the Summer Operations Manager, Kate Taylor resumes her role from last year's Fall and Spring Season as the Programme Director's Assistant. Some of her specific duties for this year are to help with the "Programmer Update" interviews held prior to the Christmas break, to aid with the preparing "Trout Rodeo" schedules and phone community members for membership dues.

Stephen Franklin and Tom Jackson Installation - 24 Sep 09: Trent Radio broadcast the installation of TrentU's new president and chancellor via a live stream provided by the University. This was a good thing, as it turned out that there was audio trouble with University's recording. We were able to give them a cleaned up version from our logger.

Trent has a radio station! Owned and operated by the students of Trent University (yes, YOU) Trent Radio broadcasts from its facilities at the corner of Parkhill and George Street in downtown Peterborough. With your full time undergraduate levy you have already contributed to the operations of Trent Radio, so why not come down and get your money's worth? This is your opportunity to be on the airwaves, and not just listen.

Trent Radio is a Producer Oriented – that means that you are your own producer. There are no Disk Jockies and Technies and Gear Heads and other similarly awkwardly titled people sitting in different booths telling you what to do. If you have a great idea, and think radio is pretty neat, if there's something you really want to say, then here is a microphone. Audio Art. World Music. Funk. Game Shows. Rock. Poetry. Concert Jazz. Modern Classical. News. Politics. We've had shows about anything you could think of, so don't think your idea is too strange. People have read books on air, played board games, performed plays they're written themselves, done aerobics in the studio, and played every kind of music the world over. We've had animal psychics, magicians, herbalists and clowns. Anything you are passionate about can make great radio. It is, by definition, a non-commercial exploration of sound brought to everyone else by you.

Trent Radio has no goal, slant, or imposed perspective on its programmers, other than adhering to CRTC regulations and our dedication to encourage community radio. This means that if you really, really want to do a call in show where you reinterpret Greek Mythology under a Marxist gaze as a guideline for 21st century living, we encourage your unique perspective.

While most campus radio stations in Canada are on a fixed or permanent schedule, Trent Radio destroys its schedule twice per year – once going into the fall, and then again in the summer. This process means incoming students have a chance to apply for a programme and get just as much priority as a community member who has been here for years on end. Every season you apply with a different proposal, even if it's for the same show. This means you can go home for the summer, change what you're doing, leave gracefully, or even take on multiple programmers if you're especially keen, and not worry about being locked in permanently to your first idea, or having to find someone to replace you.

Programmers are supported by volunteer Operators; they are someone who oversees the night of programming and is there in case you ever need help. If the CD player isn't working, if you forget what button does what, if you are nervous and suddenly the world doesn't make sense anymore – there is a network of support.

Trent Radio is open to all students and members of the community, a network of support and creativity dedicated to realising your dream of Talking Too Much. And now is the time to apply!

"Arthur" Wednesday, 09 September 2009

Many of you may be intimidated by what you must think is the coolest place ever, Trent Radio, but rest assured- we are not that cool. Let me tell you a story.

It starts with a little mystical place - some believe akin to the land of Shangri La, which once filled the void between Trent Radio and Sadleir House, your downtown student facility. This magical land was known as Peter Robinson College, and there a student could reside in their first year and participate in all the activities offered by the community of Peterborough, which usually amounted to a mixture of over indulgent merriment and hard-nosed studying. The downtown colleges were here to bridge the campus community and the Peterborough community, and they did this pretty well. Our little story concerns one such Peter Robinson College member, one of the last, actually.

She was only next door, yet she didn't come visit Trent Radio. This was not because she didn't think radio was awesome, because she did - but because she was too intimidated. She assumed we were all a bunch of esoteric music snobs concerned only with panegyric retrospectives on British folk psychedelia or other equally specific and imaginary branches of drastic musical specification. While she connected with Peterborough and its community, especially its drinking scene, she couldn't get through our green doors. If only she had known we're not that cool!

Many people come to me after getting involved in Trent Radio and say they wish they hadn't waited. Fourth year students look back and lament their lost time, knowing they have to graduate and leave and didn't get a chance to do everything they spent the past year or two getting very excited about. Time is fleeting and opportunities are short. So, what do you want to do with your time? Radio is...whatever you want to make it. Producer-oriented radio is all about what you want to bring to the table, what you are passionate about and feel the world should know. Radio is as cool as you and your awesome ideas. So, what do you want radio to be?

If there is a message here, it is to not wait to get involved - in Trent Radio or in any other student group.
