Studio A: Angela Teske conducted Studio A training three times a week during the fall season. Peter Andree's Global Enviro Policy Class were trained during the middle of fall term. This was hectic but manageable. Studio A Training continued early in the Spring Season as a crop of new programmers joined. Demand tapered down to one training session a week which allowed Angela the opportunity to organize and pre-record "Nutrition and Health" w/ Alicja Zobel. Approximately 140 people were trained in Studio A this year. Access to the digital music files were included in training, and have become a mainstay for programmers. Angela is an excellent Trainer, and provides a welcoming first experience for new programmers. She shows a very strong commitment to Trent Radio and is involved in a variety of other Trent Radio events.

Problems with broken turntable needles have been a serious problem this year, which prompted a stylus condition checklist signed by every programmer. It seemed the damage occurred during the weekend hours but was not fully determined. It has been suggested that the tables be fitted with a lock next year and accessed through key holding Operators. This procedure along with turntable training should be included in Studio A training for programmers wishing to access them.

As the digitised Spoken Word Archive continues, we will need to reintroduce a finding system.

New to Studio A: The introduction of Instant Messaging was an exciting addition in interactive programming, and has become a useful and rewarding tool for many programmers.

Local Music C.D. archives have been alphabetised and are regularly accessed.

William Bain's extensive World Music Archive will provide new adventures in programming.

Studio B: John Mather conducted studio B training twice a week during the fall season, which included Peter Andree's Global Enviro Students. Training subsided in the Spring Season which allowed John to facilitate regular Friday afternoon Programme Promo's, Station I.D.'s and Org profiles. Bookings in Studio B are frequent and regular. As the number of studio b trained programmers grows, we may anticipate a continued increase in the use of the studio, but less demand for training. If this trend continues next year we may wish to implement new duties for the trainer in the Spring Season.

Smooth Operator; broadcasts 3 times daily during the week and has been host to dozens of touring and local artists, activists, politicians and other colourful characters. Smooth Op has provided first time programmers an opportunity to jump right into Studio A and shake off some stage fright, while practicing their broadcasting skills. Our Spring Season Co-op Students have made this programme a regular feature in their skill set development. The Smooth Operator binder is refreshed daily with incoming news received through our psa@trentradio.ca email, from posters brought into the station and from programmers, operators and the general public.

Production Manager's End of Year Report for BoD Meeting 26 April 2005 Jill Staveley

Well, another fine year at Trent Radio and I'm beginning to understand that while everything seems to be the same, it is constantly changing around here. I guess that's the exciting part about producer-oriented radio. We've had a great team of OWSP & TIP staff along with some exceptional coop students this year, and have continued to make progress with our goals as well as learn more and more about what it takes to make this station work the way it does. It's a wonderful struggle to keep things moving forward, while attending to the day to day tasks that often need to be seen to immediately.

SPOKEN WORD – Rhada & Michelle have been plugging along at the tedious task of digitising the SW tapes. Over 350 cassettes have been digitised to date, and we have been working out the bugs for the CD collection. We have also begun to save and clean up logger files from radio project days that will eventually become available to programmers either via M: or via the SW server. It really has been wonderful to have them working away at this project for a 2nd year.

INCOMING MUSIC – Trevor has been a perfect fit for the incoming music position because of his interest in the new music that is coming to the station. We have been doing our best to catch up (yes still) with the backlog that occurred in the summer, and from the mix up with our Trent U. mailbox. John created a wonderful (and fast) search method for checking the new CDs, which has made the process much easier. We have also had help from Dave, one of our coop students, which has sped up the process immensely. We are currently waiting on the cassette and vinyl front for ingesting. We are still in the process of figuring out the best method for attacking this portion of the music archives so that once we start it up, everything is in fine order.

IT IS STRONGLY RECCOMMENDED THAT THE SUMMER PROGRAMME COORDINATOR LEARN THE INGESTING PROCESS IN ORDER TO KEEP UP WITH NEW MUSIC DURING THE SUMMER SEASON.

STUDIO A & B TRAINING – I did not have as much of a hand in this area of Trent Radio as I had anticipated, mostly because my in house hours did not correspond with training hours. Next year I would like to play a stronger role in this realm of Trent Radio, and make myself more available for assistance and organisation of training where necessary.

I feel that it would be an important step to organise monthly meetings with these staff members and our operators in order to encourage familiarity with one another, and to provide a space where we can let each other know about new facilities, discuss any problems or questions we are having with methods of use, and provide general feedback for one another. If it seems daunting to gather together on a monthly basis, maybe we could create/utilise an Internet forum where we can communicate with one another on a regular basis. (I think yahoo provides a service something like this)

LOCAL MUSIC & WORLD MUSIC ARCHIVES – These are the two projects that seem to get kicked to the back burner. William Bain has organized a whack of digital World Music files that have been included on the server, and are available to programmers. Thanks William!!! We still need to address the issue that we do have a plethora of World Music tracks on the M: that have not been labelled thus. The Local Music Archive is still being maintained, and the hard copies of the CDs continue to live in Studio A. I hope to access the time and patience of our coop students in order to organize this facility a little better, and still have dreams of the digital files being available on Community Access Computers at Trent Radio, Sadleir House and beyond.

RADIOFREEPETERBOROUGH – Steve McNabb hasn't stopped his hard work on this front. Brian Sanderson and I are planning on meeting at Trent Radio in the next month or so, in order to grab our local music files so they can be included on the RFP stream. There has also been discussion regarding alternating between RFP and other audio selections for stream during TRadio dark hours. It has really been wonderful to have 24hr broadcasting from Trent Radio, and I think it will be a wonderful step to include such selections as William Bain's World Music Juke Box and other independent Internet streams into the mix.

STUDIO C – Wow! The possibilities seem endless these days...unfortunately my time isn't. I have been doing my best to encourage use of the facility in order to figure out what we still need to learn. We have seen a few projects in the space and to date have completed (1) The full recording of Gorgeous Georgie III, (11) a demo for local musician Kelly Rose, (II) The mixing of local musician Mike Duguay's first full length album, (IV) The initial stages of recording for the Four Feathers Women's Hand drumming group (V) The initial stages of recording for 2 tracks that will be on Mike Martyn's upcoming CD, (VI) The initial stages of a demo for Adam Genge, a local musician who recently moved to BC, (VII) The amazing LIVE LOCAL & STREAM Radio Project Day, broadcast in part via Studio C, (VIII) TRadio Drama Series, produced by James Kerr, (IX) Trent International Choir performance during International Elimination of Racism Radio Project Day (technician: Ms L Paluck!!!)

Two other amazing things that we have accomplished this year are the facilitation of the First Person Singular Conference and the Live Broadcast from Sadleir House during our Live Local & Stream Radio Project Day. During FPS, we were able to network computers between Trent Radio and Sadleir House in order to facilitate audio recording at Trent Radio, with playback at Sadleir House. For the Live Broadcast, a computer was set up in the Dining Hall at Sadleir House, and was set up with a Shout Cast stream, which we were able to pick up via the internet and broadcast from the computer in Studio A...I say WOW!!! The possibilities seem endless for next year!
