There are currently 3 unscheduled programme proposals, put on hold from scheduling conflicts derived from specified limited availability. Of the community members, an unusual number of them are High School students, in part because of the Crestwood High School Integrated Co-op programme, where a student has only enough hours here to do a show, and because of the spiked High School student interest as a result of the summer radio camp.

Trends so far:

• **World Music:** Programming from Special Interest category 33 is especially popular this year. This seems to be due to an increased interest in radio broadcasting by international students attending Trent University.

• Audio Art: Even without the newly expanded definitions of category 36, several programmers maintain a special and focused interest in audio collage, sound experiments, "noise", and other forms of Audio Art. Proponents of Audio Art are drawn equally between the Trent University and Peterborough communities. This seems to be a trend that will continue into the future.

• **Heavy Metal:** The various sub-genres of Heavy Metal continue to be popular with students and especially first-time student programmers.

Co-op Student: Blake Redden has been appointed as a Co-op Student from Peterborough Collegiate and Vocational School, and will be completing his hours between noon and two-thirty each day. Blake has taken well to his duties maintaining the Public Service Announcements of Smooth Operator.

Goals for Fall 2011:

Trent Radio Newsletter and the Solicitation of Non-programming Memberships. During fundraising events, we attract many Trent Radio alumni who want to offer their support to us but do not have time to volunteer. In some cases their interest in programming has passed, but they still want to feel involved with Trent Radio, and still want to offer their support in some other way, but in most cases don't particularly want to come out to fundraising events. As such, donations at events are inconsistent, even while we have alumni eagerly wanting to support Trent Radio. The greatest solution we have come up with to keep alumni feeling involved, contributing financially as they want to, and not dragging them out to events, is to establish a newsletter.

The notion of a newsletter, to be published at least twice in the broadcast season, is a natural extension of the efforts already made in publishing articles in the Arthur Newspaper, of the Trout Rodeo Year in Review, and the fall-ready picture schedule pamphlet. Formalising this structure into a newsletter is a great way to help absentee Trent Radio devotees feel connected to their Trent Radio community.

Additionally, I wish to offer recipients of the newspaper the ability to contribute to Trent Radio financially through Membership. Nearly all Trent Radio memberships are acting programmers. In the past, Membership has been passively offered to the community at large, and this would represent a significant change in how we connect to potential members. Membership could be an excellent way for lovers of Trent Radio to support us without having to come out to an event or programme themselves.

Programmer & Operator Guide Books. Years ago when Barb Woolner was the Programme Director she, and several volunteers, created two guide books, a Programmer's Guide and an Operator's Guide. They were wonderful summaries of responsibility and the philosophy of these two positions, in no way replacing formal training but complimenting it nicely with creative drawings and easy to understand text. Today these guides only survive as a few paper copies.

The view has been expressed that we could benefit from these resources again. My goal is to have a Programmers and Operators book printed and made available by the end of the season, such that in future years they can be available as a resource within Trent Radio House, and given out to freshly trained Programmers and new Operators.

A Wider Audience for the Trout Rodeo Year In Review. Trent Radio is a large community, but there is always a risk of becoming insular. The Trout Rodeo Year in Review is a favourite for volunteers within Trent Radio, but with it's various in-jokes and self-celebration it can make very little sense to someone on the outside - except to give them a glimpse into a fun world where they could play a part. For the past few years I have been working on making the Trout Rodeo YIR publication more inclusive, but if we are moving forward with a Newsletter then the efforts to reach a broader community with the Trout Rodeo YIR must be greatly amplified, to the extent that it can be enjoyed by someone with even a passing familiarity with Trent Radio.

These goals are interconnected. Material from the weekly-published Arthur Articles, Programmer and Operator's books and other projects will help with the construction of the Newsletter. The Trout Rodeo YIR may end up being included in the process, as the finale newsletter of the year. It is important for both the Newsletter and the Trout Rodeo YIR that we form a mailing list of alumni who wish to participate. This list will grow over the years, but if we can establish the material and begin its circulation, it will be a good start.

Studio A Fall 2011: John Muir continues to provide the orientation element of the Studio A training sessions. Myself and Jill Staveley are providing the studio operations and technical section. It this way, new programmers have an opportunity to become acquainted with staff people while obtaining their broadcast instruction. For some programmers, especially those in evening programmes who are in when John is not, this may be the only time they have to sit down and discover what Trent Radio can be about.

Studio B Fall 2011: Jeff Lapalme assumes the responsibility of Studio B trainer. As Jeff is new to the organisation, special attention is being given on developing his technical and teaching/mentoring skills before letting him loosing on all the eager trainees in Studio B. Jeff works under the direction of Jill Staveley,

PD Assistant Fall 2011: After first being a programmer/operator, then following a year Ghana, Nika Farahani returns to take on the duties of Programme Director's Assistant. Nika was an important presence at the various Programme Proposal Workshops and has been instrumental in the preparations for the Programmers and Operator's Guide Books. She will be conducting "Programmer Update" meetings in early November.

OWSP & TIP STAFF

IMA: Travis Haws, our Assistant Archivist from last year, is up and away with the archives already as our Incoming Music Archivist. Catching up from the summer is always a tedious task that takes about 3 weeks of solid work for an experienced IMA, and I look forward to that wonderful moment in October when the incoming CDs box is empty once again.

STUDIOB: We did not have a Production Trainer lined up for this year, so were very excited when we received a few applications from some very capable students. After interviews, we offered the job to Jeff Lapalme, a new Trent Student, who spent the past few years at Fanshawe College completing the Music Industry Arts Diploma program (and he makes techno music). Jeff will be completing his training this week, and will offer Production Training and Support starting in October.

SW: We were sad to see Ekaterina Smolina go at the end of the year, but were fortunate to hire Madeleine Streich. Madeleine and I are now working on pulling the whole SW system together based upon Ekaterina's notes and report from last year. It is a very tedious process, but we are finally at a point where progress can be seen and celebrated.

What I Want To Do This Year:

We have had many successes this past year that I will talk about in my AGM Report, but the main goals I would like to achieve this year are:

- Offer the Community Radio Workshop Session 2 more times this year (between Sep & June) in it's (full day) entirety, as well as splitting it up into weekend afternoon workshops open to members of Trent Radio. - Record and produce demos for local artists (simple tracking scenarios) as I have in the past.
